

To whom it may concern:

Ms. Jones and I are Parenting Coordinators at PREF. Our parenting program is funded by a federal grant which pays our salaries, provides a small amount for the 4 major events that we put on each quarter (which are a Caregiver Appreciation in March, a family picnic in June, a Halloween carnival in October and a Christmas party in December), provides a small amount for office supplies. We rely heavily on donations from community resources to fulfill the rest of the needs of our program.

One of the parenting programs that we teach is "Inside Out Dads". This class is the main core of our program. The men learn parenting skills and ways to stay in contact with their families while still incarcerated. Once the resident graduates this class, he is eligible to participate in the Children's Visitation Center if the mother of his children signs a consent form for him to do so. He gets to visit his children by himself with just PREF staff supervision. He gets a valuable chance to reconnect with his children and use the parenting skills he has learned in class.

This Children's Visitation Center is what our department is currently trying to develop. We have been given a portion of the facilities old visitation room which PREF has to remodel some and adapt to the parenting department's needs.

We have compiled a list of what we need for the center. The age range of the children who will visit will be infants to 13 years old. They will be provided with a nutritious snack. The center will provide disposable diapers and pull ups for children needing them.

Thank you for whatever assistance you can provide to help us get what we need to open our Children's Visitation Center. Ms. Jones and I can answer any further questions you may have. We look forward to working with you.
